

## KGGTF donor, Korea's Ministry of Economy and Finance, approves 20 grant proposals in 2024 funding cycle!



The KGGTF is a partnership between the World Bank and the Republic of Korea. It was established in 2011 to support the World Bank and its client countries operationalize inclusive green growth initiatives, strategies, and investments. The KGGTF's programs are fully integrated within the World Bank's country financing and policy dialogue across seven green growth sectors.

The KGGTF donor, Korea's Ministry of Economy and Finance, has approved 20 grant proposals totaling \$10.6 million. The 2024 funding cycle focuses on the operationalization of the World Bank's Green, Resilient, and Inclusive Development (GRID) strategy.


## Building a Green Agri-Food Ecosystem in Uganda

Agriculture is vital to Uganda's economy, contributing 27% to its GDP and employing 73% of its workforce. However, it is also responsible for 46.25% of the country's greenhouse gas emissions. Uganda's National Development Plan (NDPIII) 2020-2025 and the Uganda Vision 2040 stress the need for sustainable land use and management (SLM). This KGGTF grant aids Uganda's agricultural sector in its recovery from the COVID-19 crisis and in establishing more resiliency in the future by leveraging digital technologies and identifying policies to support market development, emergency contingencies, and project management of the sector.


